Nick Roth is a saxophonist, composer, producer and educator.

His work seeks the liberation of improvisation from composition, the poetic syntax of philosophical enquiry, and the function of music as translative epistemology.

A curious predisposition and a steadfast refusal to accept the existence of boundaries between the real and the imaginary has led to collaborations with an array of international performers, composers, choreographers, visual artists, poets, sculptors, directors, festivals and ensembles.

Often engaging in conversation with scientists from such diverse fields as mathematical biology, astrophysics, forest canopy ecology, orchidology, quantum loop gravity or hydrology, his work is an investigation into how we can come to know through the art of music. Simultaneously subsumed by an insatiable appetite for literature, many of his compositions explore the symbiotic resonance of language as sound and symbol.

He has served as artist-in-residence at institutions including the European Space Agency (ESTEC), California Academy of Sciences (CalAcademy), dlr LexIcon, Centre Culturel Irlandais, Paris, Model: Home of the Niland Collection and the Irish Museum of Modern Art (IMMA).

He is artistic director of the Yurodny Ensemble, a founding member of the Water Project, co-director of Unreal Cities, and a partner at Diatribe Records, Ireland's leading independent record label for new music.

His work is represented by the Contemporary Music Centre, of which he is currently a member of the board, and is supported by Music Network's Music Capital Scheme, funded by the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media.

As a composer, his work has been commissioned and performed by the European Saxophone Ensemble, Hong Kong New Music Ensemble, RTÉ Contempo Quartet, T.S. Eliot Foundation, Happy Days International Beckett Festival, Vogler Quartett, Red Note Ensemble, Trio InVento, Kirkos Ensemble, dlr Lexicon, Kate Ellis, Lina Andonovska, Crash Ensemble, Paul Roe, Sligo International Chamber Music Festival, The Ark Cultural Centre for Children, Dublin Dance Festival, Caimin Gilmore, Liz Roche Company, Emma Martin Dance, and the National Concert Hall, with performances at the Huddersfield Contemporary Music Festival, Hay Festival, The Barbican, New Music Dublin, Cafe OTO, Ankara International Festival, Jazz d'Or Berlin, Kings Place Songlines Encounters, Bibliotheca Alexandrina and representing Ireland at the ISCM World Music Days in South Korea.

In the scientific world, he has developed collaborative projects with scientists Margaret D. Lowman, Enrico Coen, Thomas E. Lovejoy, Mark McCaughrean, Barbara Gravendeel, Iain Couzin, Francesca Vidotto and Henry S. Horn. In the space of literature he was worked with contemporary poets Anne Waldman, Steven J. Fowler, Richard Berengarten, Colm Keegan, Dairena Ní Chinnéide and Gabriel Rosenstock, engaging posthumously with the work of T.S. Eliot, James Joyce, Samuel Beckett, Roland Barthes, Anne Dufourmantelle, Jacques Derrida, Diane di Prima, Epiphanius and Dermot Healy.

As an educator, he teaches at Trinity College Dublin (TCD) and the University of Limerick (UL). He has also been invited to teach, talk and give workshops at the California Academy of Sciences, European Space Research and Technology Centre (ESTEC), l'École Nationale Supérieure Louis-Lumière Paris (ENS), TEDxStormont, University College Cork (UCC), Sonic Arts Research Centre (SARC), University College Dublin (UCD), Institute for Biodiversity, Science and Sustainability, San Francisco (IBSS), Cork School of Music (CSM), Middlesex University London (MDX), University of Aalborg, Copenhagen, the National University of Ireland Maynooth (NUI), Royal Irish Academy of Music (RIAM), Technological University Dublin (TUD) and the Norwegian Center for Technology in Music and the Arts (NOTAM).

Focusing on the creative process in early years development, he has worked as a facilitator for several educational organisations including the National Concert Hall, YouthReach, Common Ground, The Ark and Dublin City Council Arts Office.

He holds a Diploma in saxophone from the London Guildhall School of Music (Distinction) and a BA (1st Class Honours) in jazz and composition from Newpark College of Music (now DCU), studying saxophone with Kenneth Edge and Gilad Atzmon and composition under Ronan Guilfoyle and Elaine Agnew. He undertook further studies at the School of Improvised Music, New York under Steve Coleman, Ravi Coltrane, Vijay Iyer and Peter Epstein, of pedagogy in Hungary at the Kodály Institute under Katalin Kiss, of Maqam at the Labyrinth Workshop, Crete under Sokratis Sinopoulos and Ross Daly and the 49th edition of the Summer Writing Programme at the Jack Kerouac School for Disembodied Poetics in the Naropa Institute, Colorado, studying under Anne Waldman and Thurston Moore.
